For the third year in a row, we have asked pool builders to open their books and share their residential construction numbers. The response has been overwhelming. In fact, we spent the past two months compiling the data and now present it to you in this special issue.

Of course, some of the names — longtime industry veterans — will be familiar. But there are some surprises as well, and new names to note. For example, Platinum Pools has only been in business five years, and it is appearing at No. 17. Barrington Pools experienced the biggest leap, moving from No. 22 last year to No. 15 this year.

Our list reveals the revenue and growth garnered from new construction and one of the industry's current hot trends: renovations. From this list, we selected a handful of builders who experienced a unique past year and spotlighted them in expanded articles.

know that a whopping 46 percent of the Top 50 belong to a buying group? The majority (62 percent) have a written three- to five-year business plan. We also solicited their opinions on select topics and discovered, for example, that 72 percent strongly agree that states and counties should require pool builders to be licensed.

Still, charts and numbers only tell part of the story, so we dug deeper. More than 30 builders highlighted their one- and five-year goals, and best business decisions of 2003. We also put faces with the names, so you'll have more than just numbers and percentages to read.

We hope these stories (some of which are provided here online) provide insight and inspiration — and maybe even a surprise or two.
